

ALPENA COUNTY PARKS RULES

Violation of these rules may result in revocation of your camping permit and eviction without the return of any fees paid.

The parks are open May 15th through October 15th. Lakeside campsites may not be occupied for more than fifteen (15) consecutive days in any one park. Checkout time is 11:00 AM.

Reservations are accepted January 1st and require a deposit of one (1) night's stay, to be paid in advance. Holiday weekends require a deposit of two (2) night's stay, to be paid in advance.

If it is necessary to cancel a reservation, a \$10.00 cancellation fee will be charged, and the remaining deposit will be refunded. Holiday weekend reservations will be charged a \$20.00 cancellation fee, and the remaining deposit will be refunded. The cancellation fee is mandatory and may not be waived for any reason.

Shooting of firearms, air guns, gas guns, slingshots, bow and arrows, or crossbows is prohibited. Please store firearms in your possession safely: such as, unloaded in both barrel and magazine.

1. Camper and Visitor Courtesy

- a) The Park Managers are responsible for running the parks in an orderly manner. Manager decisions regarding these rules are final.
- b) Concerns or comments about these rules or manager decisions may be brought to the attention of the Alpena County Parks Commission during their regular meetings on the second Thursday of each month at 6:00 PM in the Howard Male Conference Room in the County Annex Building at Ninth & Chisholm Sts; or by mail to: 720 W Chisholm St, Alpena, MI 49707.
- c) Campers should be considerate of others. Do not engage in any violent, abusive, loud, vulgar or otherwise disorderly conduct. Please do not obstruct persons or vehicles on roads, walks or paths.
- d) Loud music and conversations are not appropriate in the parks at any time. Quiet time is 11:00 PM in the evening. Please turn music down or off, and refrain from other loud activities at that time.
- e) ATV's and motorcycles are allowed at your campsite, but may not be ridden in the parks.

2. Campsite Rules

- a) Camping is permitted on established campsites or other areas designated by the Park Manager.
- b) A campsite is a single lot occupied by a single family of not more than eight (8) individuals, or a group of not more than four (4) unrelated adults. Each campsite is allowed the use of one (1) park table and one (1) electrical outlet, when available.
- c) Outside electric coolers, refrigerators or freezers are not allowed.

- d) Visitors are allowed at your campsite between the hour of 8:00 AM and 11:00 PM. You are responsible for the conduct of your visitors.
 - e) Two (2) vehicles are allowed at each campsite. Visitors will park in the visitor's lot and not on adjacent lots
 - f) Park roads must be kept clear of parked vehicles, so that emergency vehicles can access the parks.
 - g) Dispose of refuse, rubbish, trash or garbage in the receptacles provided. Clean your campsite daily and deposit refuse in tied plastic bags.
 - h) Fires are permitted only in stoves, grills or designated areas provided. Do not put trash, bottles or cans in the fire pits. Fires are not allowed when open burning is prohibited due to extremely hazardous fire conditions.
 - i) Grey water, including dishwashing water is not allowed to be drained on the ground. Do not wash dishes near bathrooms or faucets. Please dispose of grey water as directed by the Park Manager.
 - j) Parents should accompany their children to the bathrooms. Children should not play in or around the bathrooms.
 - k) Please do not remove hot water from the bathrooms for use at your campsite.
 - l) Trenching and cutting of trees (live, dead or downed) in the parks is prohibited.
 - m) Day-Use areas are open to the public between the hours of 7:00 AM and 11:00 PM. Day-Use visitors should not use any facilities reserved for campers or boaters.
 - n) Park Managers may ask you to stop using any fireworks they feel are unsafe or are being used in an unsafe manner.
3. **Dogs, Pets and Animals**
- a) Dogs, pets and animals must be in the possession and immediate control of their owners or owners' agent; may not be left unattended at any time; and may not be allowed to run loose or otherwise create a disturbance or nuisance.
 - b) Animals must be kept on a leash not exceeding six (6) feet.
 - c) Animal owners must clean up feces and other debris created by their pets.
4. **Boat Launch and Fish Cleaning Stations**
- a) No fishing or swimming in the boat launch areas. Children are not allowed to play in the boat launch area.
 - b) Boat launch users must park their vehicles and trailers in the designated parking areas.
 - c) Fish cleaning will only be done in a designated fish cleaning station. The stations should be left clean. Any fish debris should be double bagged and placed in the proper receptacle.

PET RULES

1. PETS MUST BE ON A LEASH AND IN CONTROL BY THEIR MASTERS AT ALL TIMES.
2. WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO LIMIT ONE (1) PET PER CAMPSITE.
3. ANY PET THAT, IN OUR OPINION, APPEARS VICIOUS, UNSAFE OR UNHEALTHY WILL BE REQUIRED TO LEAVE THE PARK IMMEDIATELY.
4. PETS MAY NOT BE LEFT UNATTENDED AT ANY TIME. MOST DOGS BECOME LONELY AND OVER-PROTECTIVE OF THEIR MASTER'S PROPERTY AND OFTEN BARK CONTINUOUSLY, CAUSING STRESS TO THE ANIMAL AND ANNOYANCE IN THE CAMPGROUND. THIS MAY BE CAUSE FOR IMMEDIATE EVICTION UPON RETURN WITHOUT A REFUND.
5. BARKING DOGS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.
6. PETS "BUSINESS" MUST BE CLEANED UP IMMEDIATELY AND PETS MUST NOT BE ALLOWED TO DIG HOLES.
7. PETS MUST NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE BEACH AREA.
8. FOR THE SAFETY AND COMFORT OF PETS AND CAMPERS, PETS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE REST ROOMS.
9. DISREGARDING ANY OF THESE SAFETY RULES FOR PETS MAY BE CAUSE FOR IMMEDIATE EVICTION FROM THE PARK WITHOUT A REFUND.
